Pursuant to the stipulation of the parties, it is hereby ORDERED:

- On or before June 21, 2013, Plaintiff will complete service of process for the
 Complaint in any manner authorized by the Federal Rules of Civil Procedure. If any issue arises that prevents service of process upon any defendant prior to June 21, 2013, Plaintiff will advise the Court prior to that date.
- On or before August 20, 2013, the Defendants will file a dispositive motion addressing the Complaint.
- On or before October 21, 2013, Plaintiff will respond to the Defendants' dispositive motion. Plaintiff shall be permitted to write but not exceed forty (40) pages of text in her brief responding to Defendants' dispositive motion.
- The Defendants will have until November 20, 2013, to reply to Plaintiff's opposition.
- Plaintiff's ability to amend the Complaint pursuant to Rule 15 of the Federal Rules of Civil Procedure is unaffected by this stipulation. Should Plaintiff exercise this right, counsel for Plaintiff and counsel for the Defendants shall agree to a new briefing schedule that is consistent with the deadlines agreed to in this stipulation, subject to the approval of the Court.
